Planned events for Winterall 2009

Cub Scout

- C1. Canyon Crossing - Scouts create a bridge using boards supplied to cross a canyon.
- C2. Group Ski - Boy's work in teams to move group ski's through a challenging obstacle course.
- C3. Log Challenge - Using our special crane, the Scouts demonstrate teamwork to maneuver and place objects.
- C4. Snow Snake - Bring your snow snake, everyone will get a chance to go for his best in our "snake trench".
- C5. Stretcher Relay - Materials and instruction will be provided for the Scouts to build a stretcher and carry their "victim" through a set course.
- C6. Cat - a - Plop - Using supplied items, Scouts will use teamwork to build and shoot at targets.
- C7. Flippin' 4 Fun - Demonstrate cooking skills by cooking a pancake, then flippin' it through a target.
- C8. Handicap Obstacle Course - An event meant to increase the awareness of physically and visually challenged persons and the obstacles they face every day.
- C9. Fire Building - This is a timed string burn style event. Those who bring their own kindling and tinder will probably have an advantage. There are extra points given for fire by friction (no matches or spark).
- C10. The Egg - Each den will be given a coded fresh egg at registration. Points will be awarded for survival of the egg and also egg decoration.
- C11. Klondike sled race - Just prior to the closing ceremony, Webelos dens that bring a Klondike sled will be pulling a registered adult leader in this race. Ribbons will be awarded to the top three finishers in the race.

Boy Scout

- B1. Snow Snake - Bring your snow snake, everyone will get a chance to go for his best in our "snake trench".
- B2. Fire Building - Friction only. Use the fire you build to cook the egg you were given at registration.
- B3. First Aid - Patrols will be presented with a simulation to test their first aid knowledge and teamwork.
- B4. Orienteering - Designed to meet or exceed First Class Scout requirements for orienteering. The patrols must provide their own compass.
- B5. Pioneering - Patrols will be provided material to construct a teepee structure that will support the weight of the patrol when completed. This will be a timed event.
- B6. Group Ski - Boy's work in teams to move group ski's through a challenging obstacle course.
- B7. Shelter Building - Build a shelter using a tarp, rope, stakes, and staves you provide.
- B8. Ready, Set, Cook! - Between 10:30 and the end of lunch hour (over 2 hours), the Scouts will prepare a dessert to be judged by our judges, who will each require only a small sample. Ribbons will be awarded for the best four deserts (in the opinion of the judges). Note: All entries are to be cooked or baked using wood or charcoal as a heat source. Charcoal will be provided by Winterall staff.
- B9. Klondike Sled Race - Just prior to the closing ceremony, patrols will be pulling a registered adult leader in their unit through the race! Ribbons will be awarded to the top three finishers in the race.
